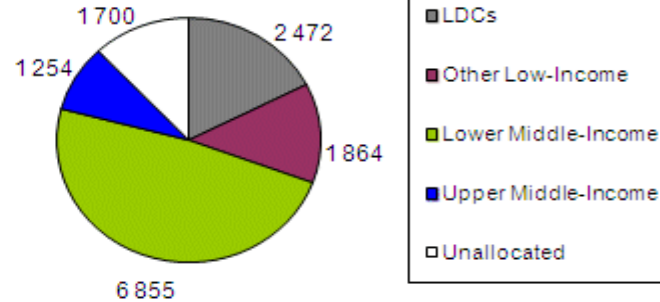

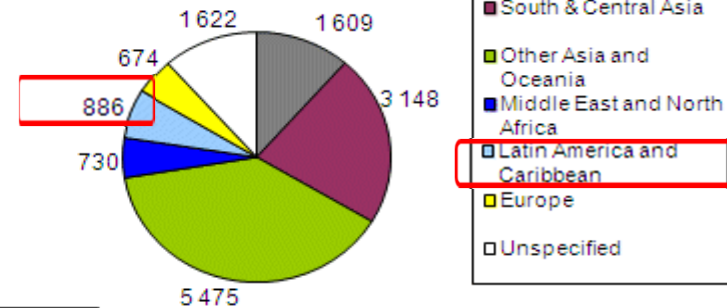

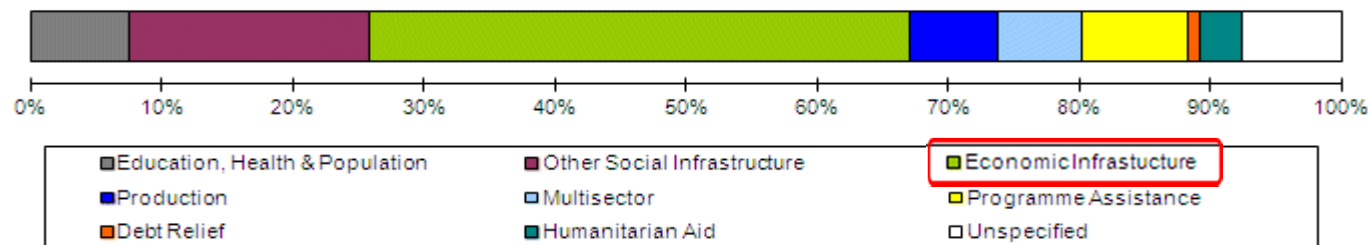
By Income Group (USD m)



By Region (USD m)

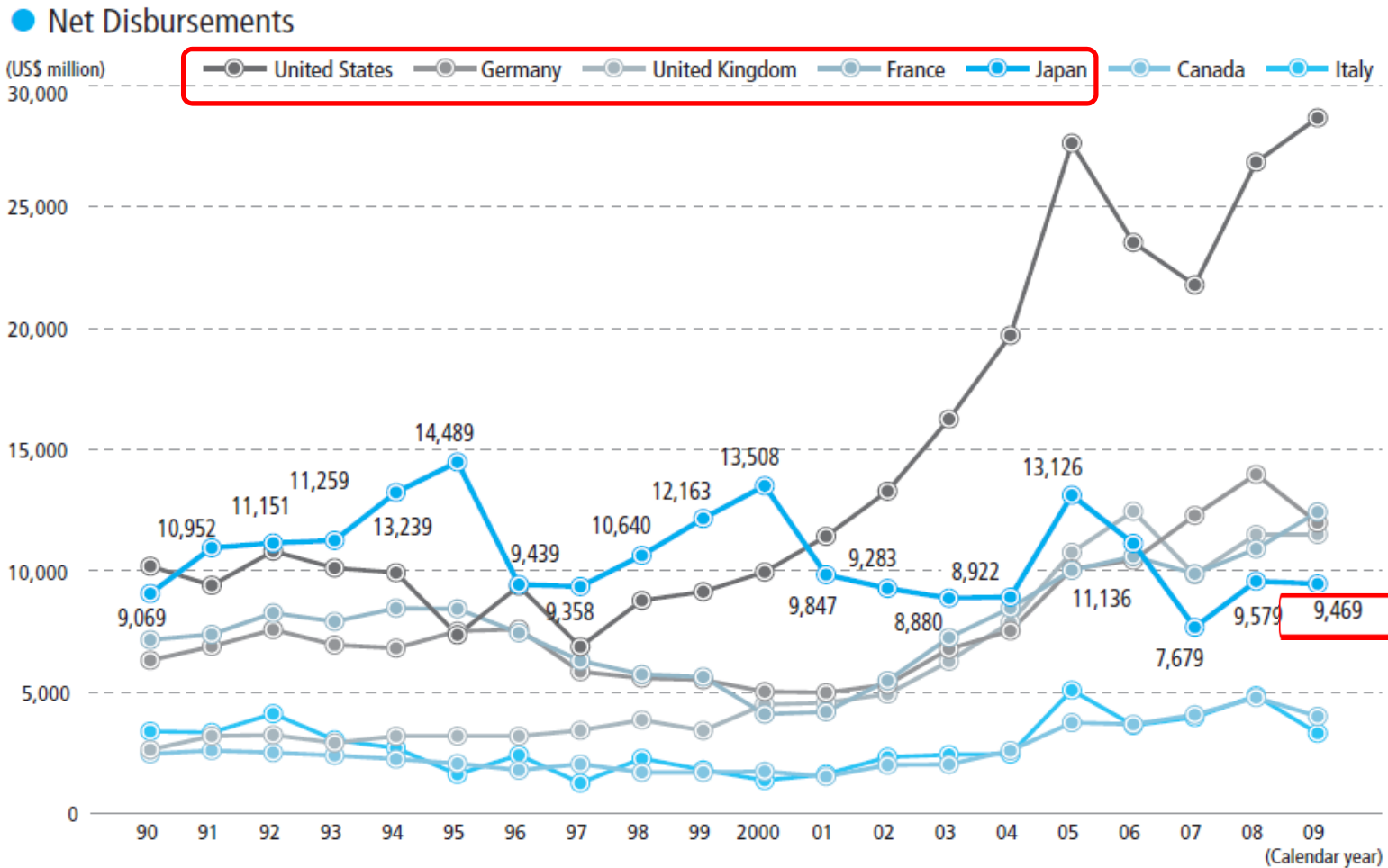


By Sector

- ✓ **Efficient and transparent operation**

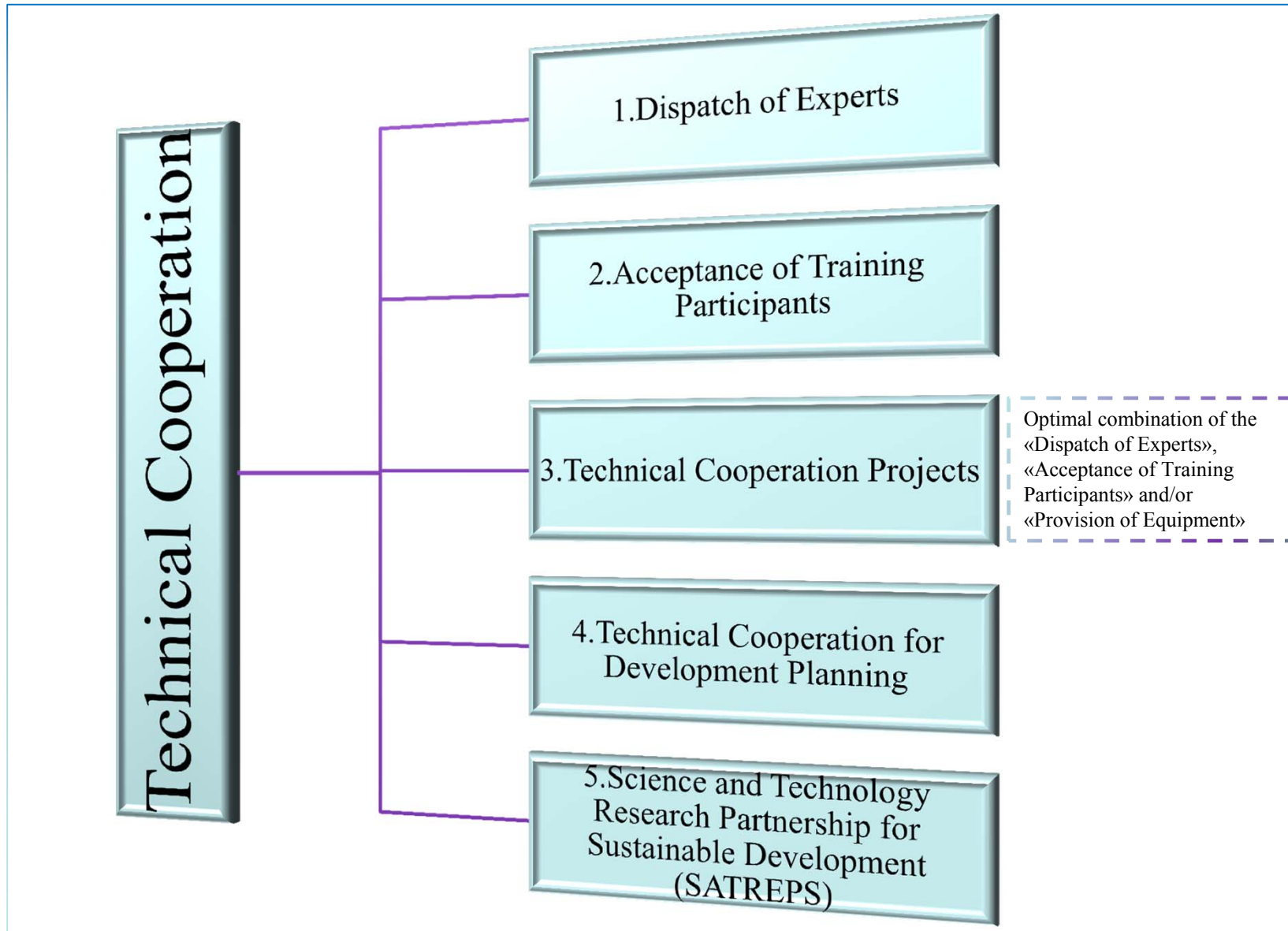

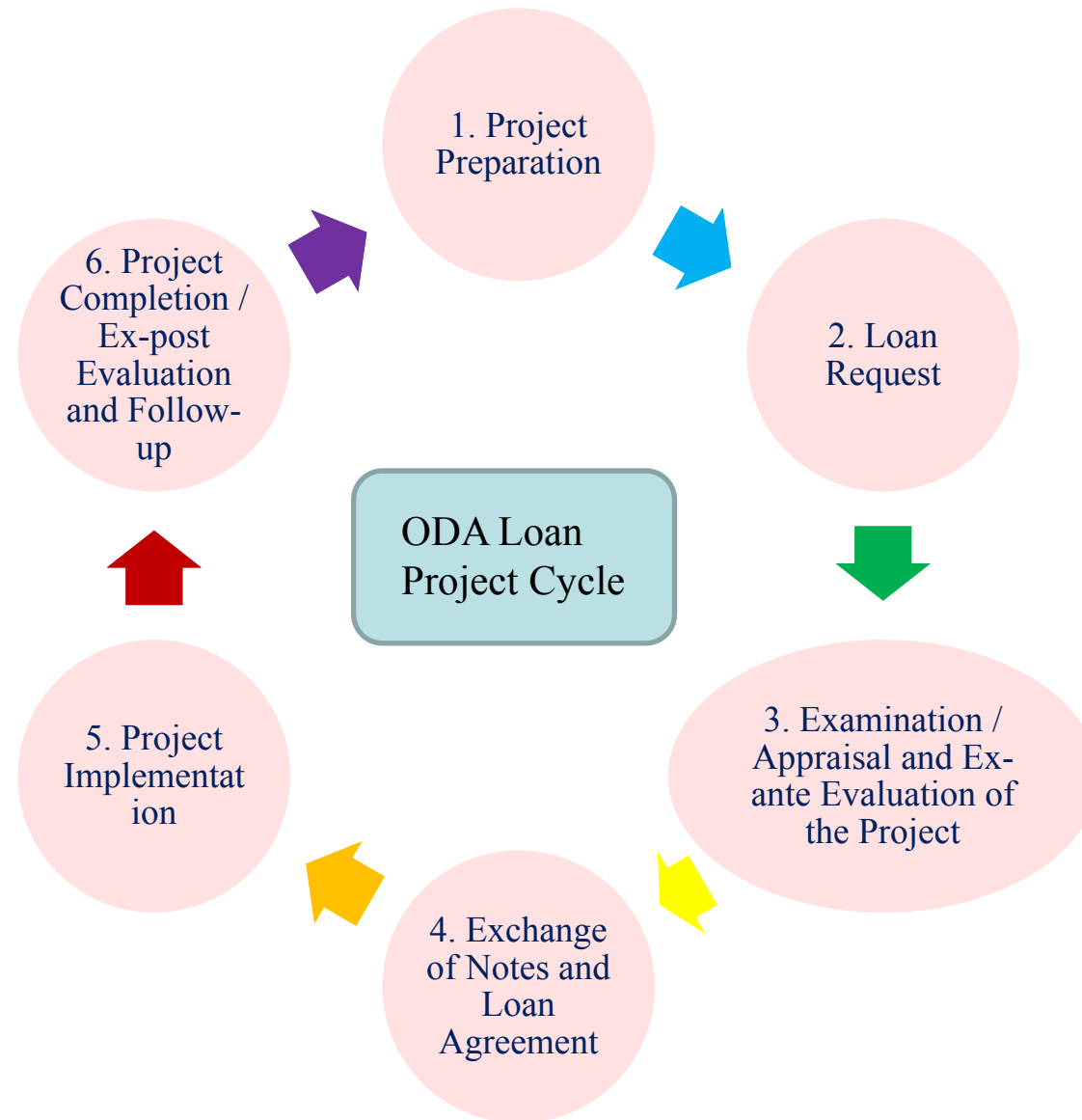

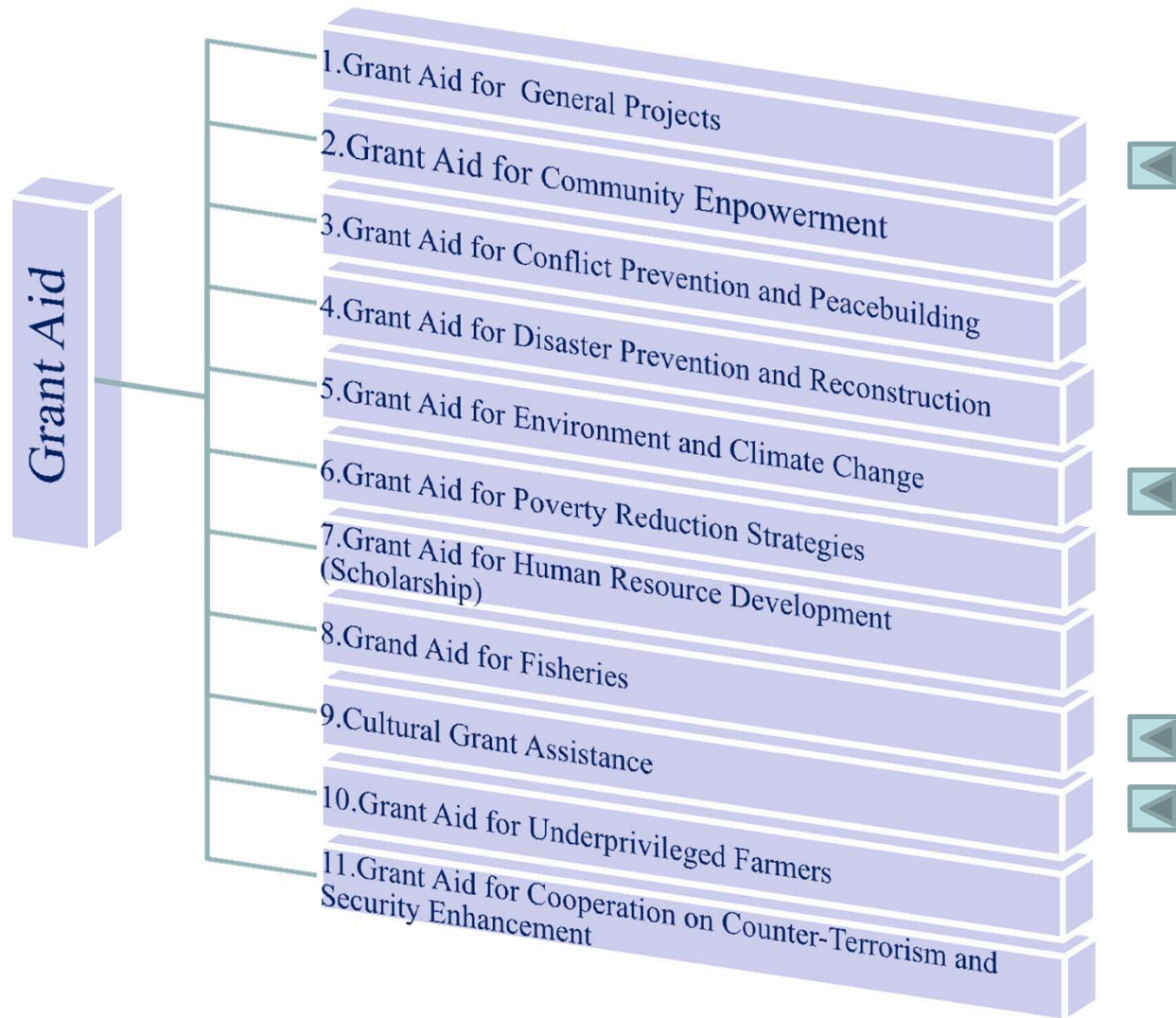

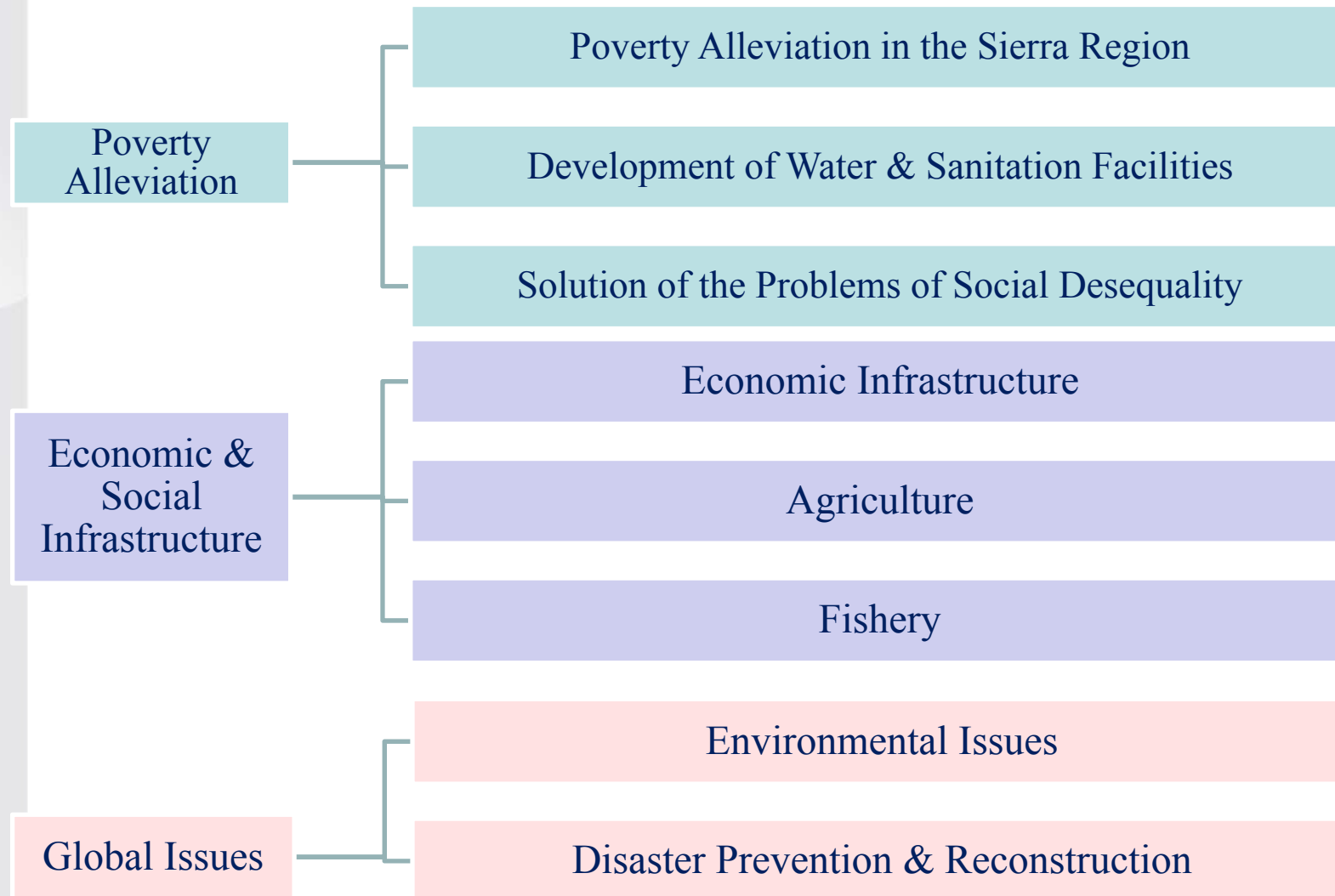

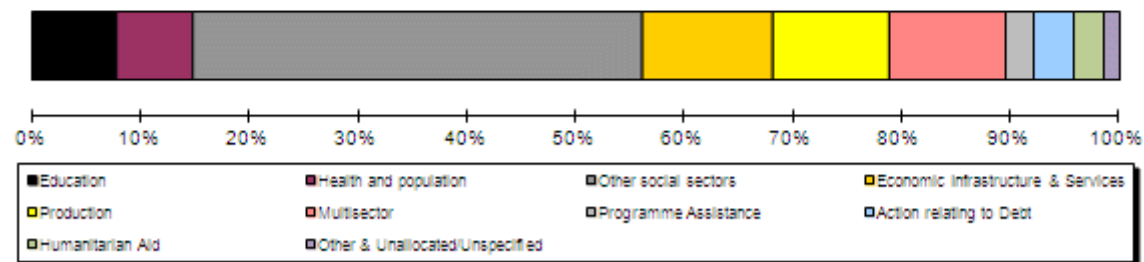

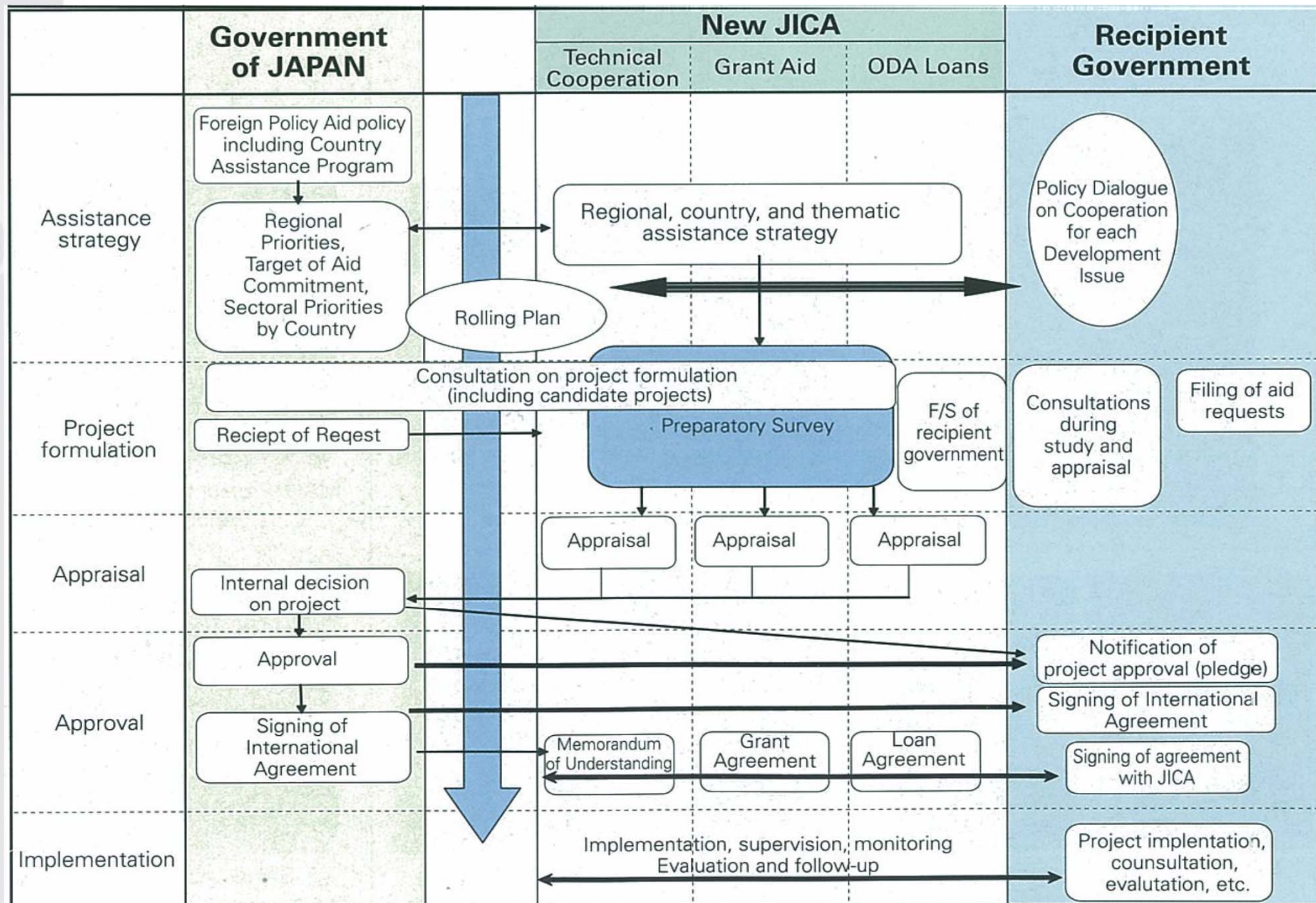
